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TRAUMA TO TEETH

THINGS TO WATCH OUT FOR FOLLOWING TRAUMA TO THE MOUTH:

- The traumatized tooth/teeth may change color to shades of gray, black or yellow. This is primarily due to pulpal necrosis (death)/deposition of pigments.
- The nerve of the tooth can become necrotic; therefore the gum tissue above the tooth needs to be checked periodically for an abscess. This would look like a bubble above the tooth. This may occur months or years following the trauma.
- Root resorption, (melting away, a normal process) may occur in some traumatized teeth.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- If the tooth/teeth are loose and mobile, avoid using the teeth and within (7-10) days the teeth will firm.
- Soft diet for the first 24 hours.
- **TYLENOL** or **IBUPROFEN** for discomfort.
- The lip or surrounding tissue may bruise, but the area should clear up within (7-10) days.
